SYNOPSIS

An impressionistic journey through Vietnam, HEAVEN'S CROSSROAD artfully explores the nuances and complexities of "looking" cross-culturally. In stylized vignettes, Takesue investigates the shift between voyeurism and intimacy, and uncovers common desires which surface through travel: to be transported to another place; to communicate beyond language; to arrest time and repossess a moment, a glance, a feeling, an encounter. Mesmerizing cinematography captures sweeping country landscapes and cities in motion, provoking questions about what it means to truly see another culture.

DIRECTOR'S BIOGRAPHY

Kimi Takesue is a Rockefeller Fellow in Film and Video and was recently awarded the 2005 Guggenheim Fellowship in Filmmaking and a New York Foundation in the Arts Fellowship. Her award-winning films SUMMER OF THE SERPENT (2004), HEAVEN'S CROSSROAD (2002), ROSEWATER (1999) and BOUND (1995) have been screened at more than one hundred film festivals, and screened at museums and cultural institutions around the world. Her films have also been awarded grants from The Rockefeller Foundation, The New York State Council on the Arts, and The Arts Council of England, among others.
