


Ways of Being Home explores the immigrant experience in the company of the Mexican community living in Northfield, a college town in southern Minnesota.

Filmed over the course of the Trump presidency, the film attests to the resilience, ingenuity and fierce determination of displaced people as they craft a life and a home away from home.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

I am a documentary filmmaker, artist and educator living and working in Northfield, Minnesota, the occupied ancestral land of the Wahpekute Band of the Dakota Nation.





The opposite of an extractivist approach, my work is built on trust, on reciprocal relationships established over time, and on the recognition that engaging communities as co-creators is a promising path to social transformation.

I provide technical training to film participants and employ inclusive methodologies to summon stories that are collectively told. In doing so, I align myself with filmmakers who work to transform power dynamics within documentary film so it ceases to be reserved for those with power interrogating people without it.



CECILIA CORNEJO SOTELO

Director/Producer/Editor

Cecilia Cornejo Sotelo is a documentary filmmaker, artist, and educator engaging rural communities in southern Minnesota in a multilayered exploration of home and belonging. Locally rooted yet globally minded, her work examines notions of belonging and the immigrant experience while exploring the traces of historical trauma on people and places.

An inaugural recipient of the 2020 McKnight Fellowship for Community-Engaged Artists, Cecilia's work has received support from multiple organizations, including the Minnesota State Arts Board, the National Association of Latino Arts and Culture, and the Jerome Foundation. Her film work has shown at venues such as MoMA's Documentary Fortnight, the Minneapolis/St. Paul International Film Festival, Cine las Americas (Texas), L'Alternativa (Spain), InVideo (Italy), Melbourne Latin American Film Festival (Australia), Puerto Vallarta International Film Festival (Mexico) and Festival de Cine Pobre (Cuba).
